# GET YOUR POOL PASSES IN APRIL BEFORE THE LONG LINES FORM!

The Kirkwood Recreation Station Aquatic Center will open for the season on Saturday, May 28. The Aquatic Center offers a multitude of activities and instruction for everyone. Enjoy five different bodies of water, each with its own attraction. The Competition Pool allows for lap swimming, diving, and free play. The Family Play Pool is designed for kids and their families, with interactive water play features, beach entry, water playground, and kid-sized slide. For older swimmers, try one of the two water slides, the open air Cannonball Express or the enclosed Runaway Freight Train. Patrons can also lounge on an underwater couch in the Leisure Pool, or float on a tube in the Lazy River. Swim and dive lessons, water aerobics, swim and dive team and much more can be a part of your summer at the Kirkwood Aquatic Center.

May 28 through August 15: Weekdays, Noon to 7:30 p.m. Weekends, 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Memorial Day and Fourth of July: 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

End of Season Hours, August 16 through September 5: Weekdays (Competition pool, family pool, and slides open, half price admission): 4:00 to 7:30 p.m. Weekends (all pools open): 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Labor Day, September 5: 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

### D Cards Required for Everyone 4 and Older

Resident and nonresident ID cards are available at the Community Center front desk during normal business hours. The cost is: \$5/residents and \$30/nonresidents, both for originals and replacements. Resident ID cards are good for three years from issue date, and nonresident ID cards are valid until the end of each pool season. In order to obtain an ID card, each purchaser 16 and over must present a valid and current Missouri Driver's License showing residential address and a current utility bill (gas, water, electric or phone), bank statement, or voter ID card, issued to his/her home address within the last three months. Purchasers age 15 and under must be accompanied by a person living at the same address who can present the documents listed above. Everyone 4 and older must have an ID card.

#### Other Summer Programming:

Early Morning Lap Swim. Get your laps in early. Monday thru Friday, May 31 thru August 26, 6:00 to 7:30 a.m. Residents/\$60; nonresidents/\$85. Free for season pass holders.

**Tot Time.** Kids age 5 and under can get on board during this special time for preschoolers in the family play pool. Parents: Bring your ID card, and your child gets into this session for \$2.50, while you get in for free. Nonresident admission is \$4 for tot time (no ID required). Monday thru Friday, May 31 thru August 15, 10:15 to 11:45 a.m.

NEW! Lifeguard in Training. Ages 10 to 15. This specialty program trains 'tweens and young teens in water rescue and other life skills to prepare them for future employment as lifeguards. Teaching points include water safety, leadership, and personal responsibility. Daily activities include a workout, skill practice, rescuethemed games, and discussion. This class meets Monday through Friday 10 a.m. - 12 noon. Each camper must demonstrate independent swimming and treading ability on first day of camp. Post-program volunteer opportunities available. Includes junior membership in the United States Lifesaving Association. For additional information, visit www.backyard-lifeguards.com. Three sessions: June 6 to 17; June 20 to July 1; July 11 to 22. \$180 per session.

NEW! Stand-Up Paddleboard Fitness. Enjoy an intervalstyle workout, but while standing on a paddleboard. Curls, squats, chest press, planks, abs, even burpees - with active rest between sets. May include duck walking in the pool, prone paddling, or seated kicks, depending on energy of class. STRICT MAXIMUM due to equipment, so sign up early. (Not included in the 10-class punch card.) Meets on Mondays and Wednesdays, 9:00 to 10:15 a.m. Two sessions available. Demo Class (June 6 and 8) session cost: \$26/residents, \$28/nonresidents. Regular class cost (June 13 to July 20: \$156/residents; \$182/nonresidents. Class facilitated by SUP St. Louis.

#### Walk the Lazy River with the River Walk Club!
