Don't forget to complete and return your Census forms in April. Each form is "geo-coded" with a bar code that pinpoints your exact location. The address that appears on the front of the form is for the Post Office's use ONLY and has no bearing on how you are counted. The Census Bureau has assured us that each and every geo-coded form will accurately pinpoint your location. An accurate count is crucial to Kirkwood's future, so please complete and return your forms. We can't move forward until you mail it back. Be Counted in 2010. Thank you!

## CFL Trade-In

Recycle CFL Bulbs at City Hall

CFL (compact fluorescent lamp) lightbulbs are more energy efficient than the old-fashioned kind. They use less power and they last longer. Whereas the average incandescent bulb will last for 750 hours, the average CFL will last between 6,000 and 15,000 hours. But you may be afraid to buy them because you've heard they contain mercury and must be recycled in a safe manner.

Never fear. Bring your burned-out CFL bulbs to Kirkwood City Hall, 139 S. Kirkwood Road. Not only will we dispose of them safely, we'll give you a new one for FREE for each one you bring in. Just come to the window at Finance (on your right as you enter City Hall) and drop off your used CFLs today!!
