



## CITY OF KIRKWOOD: YEAR IN REVIEW

- ◆ We started off the year with the completion of the Walker Lake Phase 4 construction project in January, which consisted of replacing the concrete channel leading from Geyer Road to the lake with a more naturalized stream bed.
- ◆ In April, voters passed the quarter-cent Fire/EMS sales tax, which will allow the City to hire seven new firefighters/paramedics and place a third ambulance in service: Thank You.
- ◆ In June, the City held its first-ever Route 66 Festival, featuring the start of the Great Race, a cross-country vintage car rally from Kirkwood to Santa Monica, CA
- ◆ In September, Kirkwood Park was the scene of a memorable September 11 display after volunteers set up hundreds of flags around Walker Lake.
- ◆ Another successful Greentree Festival was held in September thanks to good weather, the hard work of the planning committee (below), the generosity of our sponsors, and the great spirit of all who attended.



### Other 2015 Highlights:

- ◆ In 2015, the City held a series of Community Day events in Kirkwood parks. The first one on June 4 was held at Fillmore Park. The next three were held at Avery Park, Monfort Memorial Park, and Meacham Memorial Park.
