Here are a few of the things we have recently done and are doing to make our Kirkwood Community a better place for all:

- ◆ Helped create and implement a simple, accessible, and anonymous method for citizens to bring instances of discrimination or other problems to the attention of our City government - the Caretaker Alert Form (CAF).
- ◆ Led in creating and promoting, with the help of the City of Kirkwood, an ordinance protecting the rights of LGBT citizens, which has been approved by the Kirkwood City Council.
- ◆ Worked to involve Kirkwood youth in civil rights and social justice issues by sponsoring an essay contest and an art fair focused on human rights in our community.
- ◆ Conducted a Disabilities Survey to identify and help address the needs of those with disabilities to help them enjoy and improve the quality of life more fully in our community.
